



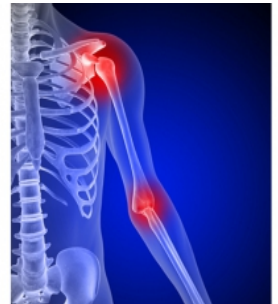

The module comprises a prereading component of 4 to 6 hours with MCQs to check comprehension in preparation for a day-long workshop of interactive tutorials, hands on physical examination and treatment techniques with feedback and case discussions.

The upper limb pain module is the third of four modules being offered by the Australian Association of Musculoskeletal Medicine leading to the award of the 'Certificate in Musculoskeletal Medicine'. These modules offered in a repeating annual cycle in Brisbane, cover the assessment and management of pain and disability in the (i) low back, (ii) neck and upper back, (iii) upper limbs and (iv) lower limbs.

The modules can be taken independently and in any order, but all four modules must be successfully completed to be awarded the certificate.
