The low back pain module is the first of four modules being offered by the Australian Association of Musculoskeletal Medicine leading to the award of the '*Certificate in Musculoskeletal Medicine*'. This is the third cycle of modules held in Brisbane, the first two being highly rated by participants. These modules cover the assessment and management of pain in the (i) low back, (ii) neck and upper back, (iii) upper limbs and (iv) lower limbs. Any of the modules can be taken independently but all four modules must be successfully completed to be awarded the certificate.
